## Drifting in an Elysian Haze



The Elysian Fields, or Elysium, is a concept from Greek Mythology, envisioned as a paradise where heroic and virtuous souls find eternal rest. Through Elysian haze -a liminal veil between the earthly and the transcendent-Parth Kothekar invites us to explore the interplay of myth, memory, and artistic vision. This notion has long served as an evocative metaphor in art, a space where humanity's aspirations for paradise meet the ineffable beauty of the unknown.

Parth Kothekar's work deftly navigates the duality to the Elysian vision - both the longing for eternal repose and the subtle reminder of impermanence.



### **Parth Kothekar**

Parth kothekar was born and brought up in a middle class family in Ahmedabad. He's been a self taught artist since childhood, has won many prices for his skills, and was featured in school magazines and local news papers.

Following school, he joined animation institute to pursue his artistic career. However since this education mostly focused on 3D art, Parth decided to quit the animation and follow his own path of 2D art. He took on making art as a full time occupation, and in the following years he discovered and explored paper cutting as an artform.

The idea of papercut is germinated out of his graffiti practice, when one day he pictured the stencils to be inversed. He followed the idea and was fascinated by my own work. Initially it was a hobby; once he had enough artworks on hand to exhibit them.

In 2013 he held his first exhibition showcasing his first 100 artworks in Kanoria Centre for Arts, Ahmedabad. This exhibition was a pivotal point in his career as a papercut artist as the response he received confirmed his path forward. Following which he exhibited his art in various cities across India.


His way of work is that of challenging himself. It has found a structure wherein he works with different thematic series, of various papercutting art-forms, from time to time. This includes animations, 3d lamps, patterns, portraits and more. The forms that his paper take are unique with each exploration as he believes in experimenting and exploring different kinds of techniques to challenge and improve himself and his work.

He has been invited by the New Zealand government to showcase his work in 2016; his work has also been exhibited internationally and featured in many prestigious publications. He work gained popularity after being featured on History TV in 2018, on Instagram in 2019, and on Google's homepage in 2023.



Human – construction in nature from bird's perspective






